Whanau Profile – Kite Rapu I te Ora Trust

Kite Rapu I te Ora Trust

(The vision - In search of wellbeing) based in Opotiki.

In 1993 KRITO Trust was established by Irimana Gemmell, Trust Chairman. Base activities were working with Rangatahi. The Trust provided youth mentoring and adventure therapy programmes. This is still the core activity however the trustees have broadened the programmes to now include a well-established Early Childhood Centre where we are also providing positive parenting/whānau development programmes.

The present trustees are currently revamping and developing sexual abuse training packages for people who wish to work in this specialised field. All our trustees are Māori with the exception of Anne Dorée who has her own private practice as a Child Therapist and registered ACC Sexual Abuse Counsellor. We are exploring a variety of education and healing options while remaining linked to the vision of the trust. Our vision is to eliminate all forms of violence, restore whānau wellbeing through positive role modeling, building networks and creating positive relationships. Trustees have stayed connected to each other over two decades.

Description of this sector

In 1988 I set up an organisation based in Opotiki which was one of the 29 affiliated groups to Te Kakanō o Te Whānau Inc a national organisation that worked in the areas of Rape, incest sexual abuse and related violence. In 1996 I moved off to do some studies. Tracy Hillier picked up the role from me then.

Representation on Steering Group

Representative for Ngā Kaitiaki Mauri

In July 2007 I was nominated to the task force, attending my first meeting in Wellington. I have been in consultation meetings with the working group on the constitution. Meetings with Victim Support and TAFV to find a way forward in supporting each other's work.

I believe the main achievements of the network to date has been the establishment of a bicultural relationship with our Tauīwi partners and the opportunity to sit around the table with government officials to negotiate a way forward for survivors of sexual abuse, however there is still a way to go to address Māori concerns and the inequalities. Māori will always struggle to move forward and whether Māori needs are addressed I'm forever hopeful though, while there is an imbalance of power and unless those in power recognise, acknowledge and release the control nothing much will change for Māori.

To speak on behalf of TOAH-NNEST to Community groups, Māori Wardens hui (National & Regional level, Māori Women's Welfare League, Hapū & Iwi kōmiti hui, Local media / radio talk back, Trust Board meetings, and District Council meeting.

What are your main achievements?

Being involved in TOAH-NNEST with women and men who are passionate about working towards the elimination of all forms of violence.

What is your vision for the Network?

- To build a strong relationship with Government and the various government sectors.
- For both whare to be fully funded with their own autonomy.
- To establish a national office fully resourced where both houses are situated side by side with equal resources.

My Mokopuna, Te Awhina

Te Awhina who turns 19, 26 June 2014, has always been very active in the work both her koro and I have done. Prior to taking up the option of travel and tourism she had considered Social work but her uncle advised her against it because of her nature and personality.

She has been one of our "Taiohi Ora" Youth Leaders for Kite Rapu i te Ora Trust programme "Ko wai au? Know yourself first programme from a very young age. The programme focuses on the development of youth skills and ability towards leadership which is one of the key objectives. Other key objects are around respect, communication and trust.

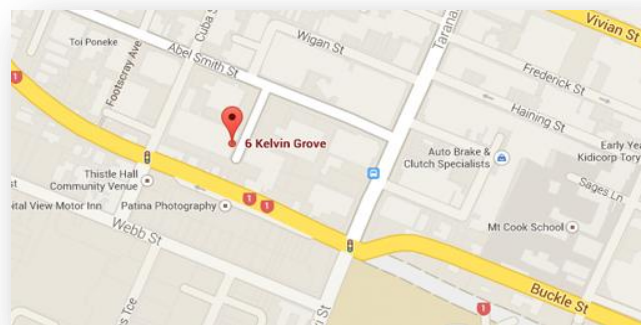
Three aspects of the programme focus on
